

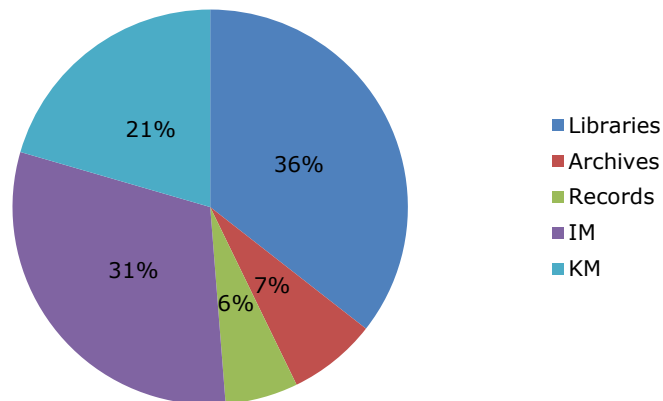
UK Information Workforce - Sector Factsheet: Law sector

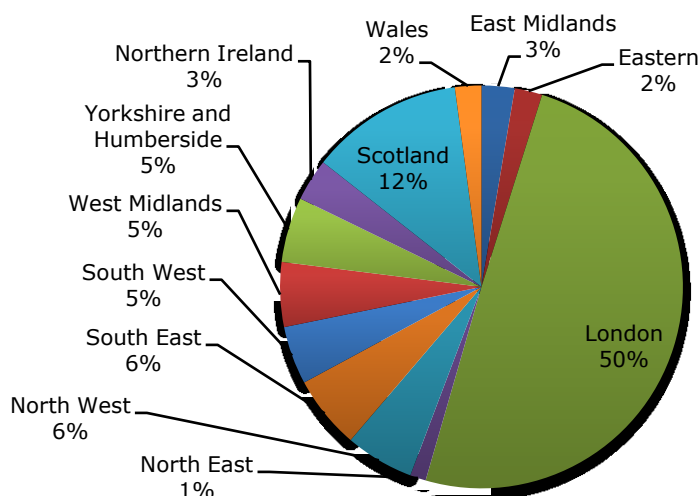
Workforce size, and distribution

There are an estimated 86,376 people working in the entire UK Information Workforce. It is estimated that 2,505 (2.9%) of those work in Law settings.

Distribution of sector workforce by domain



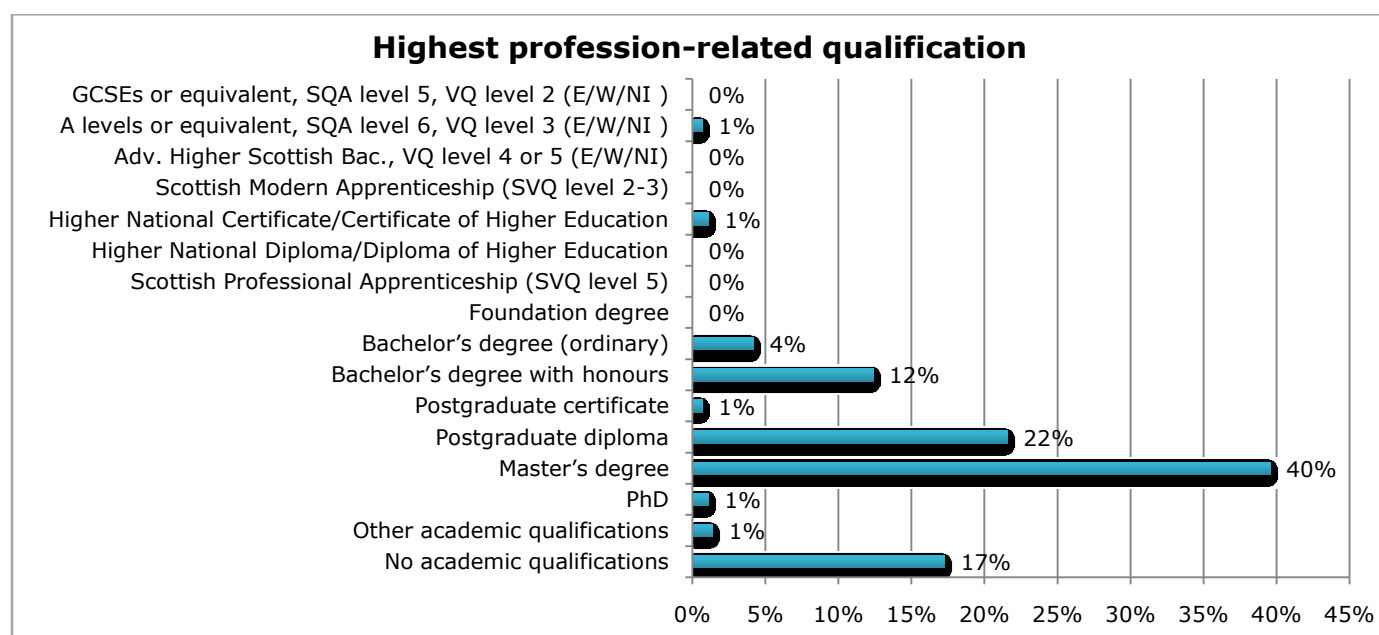
Distribution of sector workforce by region
